REMINDER:

Graduating Student Employees: Once a student employee graduates, they are no longer eligible for student employment. If their employment will continue, an ETF must be submitted to change their employment status to part-time non-student. For those not continuing their employment after graduation, submit an ETF to discharge prior to their last working day.

Student Employees and Summer employment: Student employees not enrolled in Summer classes are not FICA exempt. Student employees enrolled in Summer classes remain FICA exempt.

Submit a list to HR (fdnhr@cpp.edu) ASAP indicating students who are enrolled in summer classes. If your operation is closing for Summer or have employees not working during Summer, submit a list to HR to deactivate their account in UKG.

WHAT IS CALPERS?

The CalPERS pension plan is a defined benefit plan where retirement benefits are based on a formula, rather than contributions and earnings to a savings plan. Retirement benefits are calculated based on a member's years of service credit, age at retirement and final compensation. CalPERS members become vested after 5 years of CalPERS eligible service with a CalPERS agency. CalPERS members contribute to the plan through payroll deductions.

Mental Health Toolkit



Mental Health Awareness Month is observed every May to help break the stigma and support people living with mental health conditions. Mental illness refers to a range of diagnosed conditions that affect a person's mood, behavior, feelings, thinking and, ultimately, ability to function in daily life.

Although mental illness affects us through family, friends and co-workers, fortunately there is much we can do to support their health and happiness.

Half of adults in the U.S. will be diagnosed with a mental disorder.

7 Ways To Boost Your Mental Health

Get moving

Express gratitude

Get a good night's sleep

Connect with loved ones

Spend time outdoors

Practice meditation

Be kind

Taking care of your mental health is just as important as maintaining your physical health, and having a mental health "toolkit" can make a big difference when life feels overwhelming. Think of it as a personalized collection of strategies and resources that you can reach for when you need extra support.

For your own toolkit, try practicing daily mindfulness habits such as intentional breathing, stepping outside for some sun, or writing down small things you're grateful for each day. Small, consistent actions can add up to stronger mental well-being over time.

In addition to daily habits, your mental health toolkit can include longer-term practices that build resilience. Identify a few trusted people you can call when you need to talk, bookmark a couple of calming podcasts or playlists, and keep a journal handy to help process emotions.

Seek help from your primary care doctor or a mental health professional if you're concerned about your mental health.
